


What is cultural heritage?

Resources inherited from the past in all forms and aspects: tangible, intangible and digital. Including:

- Monuments and sites
- Landscapes and natural sites
- Skills, knowledge and expressions of human creativity (oral traditions, festivals, songs, etc.)

- Collections in museums, libraries and archives (paintings, books, artefacts, etc.)
- Film heritage



Why a Year for Cultural Heritage?

- To encourage the sharing and appreciation of Europe's cultural heritage as a shared resource;
- To encourage a better protection/use of heritage by all involved
- To raise awareness of common history and values;
- To reinforce a sense of belonging to **Europe**



Eurobarometer on Cultural Heritage



Knowledge and perceived importance of cultural heritage

68% of Europeans would like to know more about Europe's cultural heritage.

✓ Values attached to Europe's cultural heritage

82% take pride in it, and agree it can improve quality of life and a sense of belonging to Europe

70% agree they **feel pride in cultural heritage from a European country other than their own**, or that living close to places related to Europe's cultural heritage can give people a sense of belonging to Europe.



Labelling of events

What can be labelled?

- Cultural events or performances, along with media and launch events, exhibitions, shows;
- information, education or awareness-raising campaigns;
- festivals, including film festivals;
- conferences, symposia, forums debates;
- > studies and surveys;
- training sessions/workshops; research activities;
- visits and exchanges;
- digital projects, etc...



Labelling of events

Who awards the label?

- National coordinators to projects and initiatives taking place in Member States
- European Commission and the members of the Stakeholders' Committee - to cross-border projects & EU funded projects

Heritage in transition: reimagining industrial, religious, military sites and landscapes

- Aims at
 - promoting good practice and smart ways to transform Europe's industrial, religious and military heritage for new use(r)s
 - turning it into a driver of sustainable development for European cities and regions.
- Target groups: Local/regional authorities and communities, heritage professionals and architects.
- 3 components



Who takes part?

- EC services dealing with culture, regional development, research and innovation
- Creative Europe networks: Future for Religious Heritage, European Route of Industrial Heritage (ERIH), Architects' Council of Europe (ACE)
- ICOMOS Committees: **PRERICO** (on places of religion and rituals), IcoFort (on military heritage)
- Urban Group of the European Parliament, European Committee of Regions; Eurocities



Future for Religious Heritage

A non-faith organisation open to all, bringing together those working to protect religious heritage across Europe.

- 38 Countries
- 56 Full Members
- 88 Associate Members



Survey on religious heritage

- A poll run in April **2014** by Future for Religious Heritage (FRH), powered by Sociovision and Toluna
- Sample: 6000 citizens over 18 from 8 EU countries (France, Germany, UK, Spain, Belgium, the Netherlands, Poland and Sweden)
- Do you personally think that preserving and protecting churches and other religious buildings is crucial for your community's current and future life? **79%** YES (absolutely or rather)




Survey on religious heritage

- Do you personally think that preserving and protecting churches and other religious buildings is crucial for your community's current and future life? **79%** YES (absolutely or rather)
- According to you, churches and other religious buildings
 - should be solely dedicated to religious practice and events related to religion? 56% YES (absolutely or rather)
 - can be open to other non-religious cultural activities (e.g. concerts, conferences, exhibitions) if such activities can finance their maintenance and preservation? 72% YES

(4) Heritage in transition: re-imagining industrial, religious, military spaces for the regeneration of urban and rural areas



Main components:

- Exchange of good practice in heritage renovation and re-use
- Engaging with communities: Torch initiative, cross border twinning for adaptive re-use, events with young people
- Urban/rural regeneration and sustainable development: valorising EU funded projects e.g. ROCK- Regeneration and Optimisation of Cultural Heritage in creative and Knowledge cities

Beneficiaries: local and regional policy makers, heritage professionals and architects, researchers, civil society

Component III: Urban/rural regeneration and sustainable development

- **URBACT** projects on the reuse of vacant spaces




Protecting the Jewish Cemeteries of Europe


Objectives:

- Highlight good practice in preserving and restoring Jewish burial sites;
- Identify specific opportunities for cross-fertilisation and stronger interactions between various stakeholders;
- Pave the way for **future** interventions using local, national and European Union resources for heritage-related activities.




