Visby Cathedral Sankta Maria 800 years

A rich jubilee year is coming to its end. Every day we have celebrated our cathedral with services, discourses, exhibitions, guided tours, and music.

The jubilee began on New Year's Day with a presentation of the cathedral's history in Words & Music. The jubilee logo was lit up on the church's southern wall. The jubilee hymn From Limestone Ground, written by Dean Anna Lundgren (lyrics) and Cathedral Organist Peter Alrikson (music), was sung for the first time.

The Peace Dove Project, which offered everyone a unique opportunity to express their wishes and raise their voices for peace, turned out to be a far greater success than we had expected. 5,000 doves were submitted from all over Gotland. The project was inaugurated on May 1st with a unique concert by Christoffer Lundquist. The original plan was to let the doves hang during May – but they will remain until the end of the year.

In honour of the cathedral's jubilee and its connection to the Hansa, Visby hosted the Hanseatic Day 2025. An international organ project, led by the parish, organized a composition competition whose selected works were published in a Hansa Organ Book. The first Hansa Organ Festival, with participants from 15 Hanseatic cities, featured ten double concerts in the cathedral and five concerts in the countryside. The festival was such a success that the Hansa decided to include a festival in future Hanseatic Days.

The real birthday, Sunday, July 27th, was the highlight of the year — a three–day celebration. Jan Eliasson opened the festivities on Friday with a lecture on peace. Saturday was filled with a variety of activities for all ages and concluded with a concert by Tomas Andersson Wij. Crown Princess Victoria and Prince Daniel honoured the jubilee mass with their presence — a service that could also be followed on a large outdoor screen. Among the guests were representatives from our partner diocese in Tanzania, from Lübeck, from the Diocese of Linköping, and from the Swedish Parliament. Agneta Sköld had composed Mary's Praise; Peter Alrikson presented a work for trumpet and organ combining an 18th–century piece with modern melodic elements; Alma Emilsson had set a psalm from the Psalter to music. And of course, the jubilee hymn was sung. A grand "Swedish fika" was served outdoors, with jubilee pastries.

The final months of the year feature many highlights, including Handel's Messiah and the launch of a gluten- and alcohol-free Sankta Maria Lager, before the year concludes at midnight on New Year's Eve.
