A couple of weeks earlier, Two Sisters School had won the Kulal lower zone competition in football in Olturet, both for girls and boys, beating three other schools. They were now representing the zone on the subcounty level. Two Sisters School delivered an outstanding performance, emerging as the second-best team in both the boys' and girls' football. This marks a significant improvement from the previous competitions and highlights the continued growth and success of the school's sports program. The achievement is a reflection of the learners' dedication, teamwork, and the commitment of their teachers who act as the coaches.

In addition to the ball games, the school had the honor of hosting World Vision, who joined the closing ceremony to mark the Day of the African Child. The celebration featured songs and poems presented by various participating schools, with Two Sisters School actively contributing to the performances.

WATER PIPELINE AND TANK INSTALLATION

PACIDA, a dedicated non-governmental organization, has successfully developed a water pipeline system in Two Sisters Village. As part of the project, two elevated water tanks have been erected at separate strategic locations within the village. This initiative marks a significant milestone in improving water accessibility and promoting better health and hygiene for both the school and the surrounding community. The project is expected to greatly reduce the burden of water collection, particularly for women and children, while ensuring a reliable supply of clean water for domestic and school use. A recent meeting held at Two Sisters School focused on preparations for the upcoming graduation ceremony, instead of the harmful FGM, scheduled for September 2025. During the meeting, several key proposals were made by parents and stakeholders to ensure the occasion is memorable and impactful. It was proposed that each of the 22 girls graduating from the anti-FGM program be gifted with a graduation gown and a cross, personalized with the initials of each graduate. To symbolize the significance of the occasion, a bull will be slaughtered, marking the community's commitment to stopping FGM. Graduation certificates will be issued to the girls to recognize their transition and achievement. The event will feature speeches and songs, by women's fellowship leaders and local pastors, highlighting the importance of abandoning harmful cultural practices and embracing positive rites of passage. This graduation marks a significant milestone, a momentum occasion, in the ongoing campaign to end Female Genital Mutilation in the region and to empower girls through education and community support. It will also serve as a platform to encourage more community members to join the fight against FGM and uphold the rights and dignity of girls and women.
