## **Core Principles in Community Based Psychosocial Support**

PRINCIPLE	IN PRACTICE THIS MEANS
1. HUMAN RIGHTS AND EQUITY	<ul> <li>✓ Promotion of human rights in all affected and use of Rights Based Approach (RBA)</li> <li>✓ Protection measures in place for those who are at heightened risk of human rights violation</li> <li>✓ Non-discrimination and fairness in all activities and work (availability and accessibility etc)</li> </ul>
2. PARTICIPATION	<ul> <li>✓ Involvement of local people as much as possible in assessment, design, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of assistance</li> <li>✓ Bottom up structure throughout organisation and necessary structures in place for community input to impact on proposals and ongoing activities</li> </ul>
3. DO NO HARM	<ul> <li>✓ Assistance promotes connectors and minimises dividers in the local community</li> <li>✓ Actions taken are culturally sensitive, self-reflective and are based on adequate local information</li> <li>✓ There is ongoing evaluation of projects and lessons learnt are incorporated into new activities</li> </ul>
4. BUILDING ON AVAILABLE RESOURCES AND CAPACITIES	<ul> <li>✓ Resource based assessments are undertaken</li> <li>✓ Efforts are made to build on local capacities, support self-help and strengthen existing resources</li> <li>✓ Identification, mobilisation and strengthening of skills in community and society</li> </ul>
5. INTEGRATED SUPPORT SYSTEMS	✓ Services provided are not stand-alone, but feed into and strengthen other existing systems in the community e.g. health services, school services etc.
6. MULTI-LAYERED SUPPORTS	<ul> <li>✓ Activities are identified on the correct layer of the intervention triangle and the appropriate activities are carried out for relevant groups (basic services - community and family supports - focused support such as PFA)</li> <li>✓ Activities on different layers complement and build upon each other.</li> <li>✓ Staff know their mandate and have the necessary knowledge to link up and refer to specialized services when necessary</li> </ul>
